Imperforate Pair

Issued in memory of President Warren G. Harding. First placed on sale (flat plate Perf. 11) on September 1, 1923 at Marion, Ohio and Washington D. C. The imperforate stamps were first placed on sale November 15, 1923 at the Philatelic Agency in Washington D. C. and Rotary Press printings were issued September 12, 1923.

ISSUED to commemorate the 300th anniversary of the settling of the Wiltamers in New Netherlands, now the State of New York. First placed on sale on May 1, 1924.

Viking Ship

TO commemorate the 100th anniversary of the arrival at New York, on October 9th, 1825, of the first immigrants to the United States from Norway. First placed on sale May 18, 1925. The 5c stamp features an exact copy of a Viking ship that was sailed to Chicago from Norway in 1883 by Capt. Magnus Anderson and a crew of twenty sailors.

Surrender of Fort Sackville

To commemorate the 150th anniversary of the surrender of Fort Sackville near the present site of Vincennes, Ind. This stamp honors the great explorer who helped win the Northwest Territory to the American side.

To commemorate the completion of the Ohio River canalization project between Cairo, Ill. and Pittsburgh, Pa. First placed on sale October 19, 1929.

To commemorate the 90th anniversary of the invention of the first incandescent electric lamp by Thomas Alva Edison. Was issued in flat plate, and rotary press sheets and in rotary press coils. First placed on sale (flat plate) on June 5, 1929 at Mead Park, N. J. Rotary press printings in sheets and coils were issued June 11, 1929.

Battle Of Fallen Timbers

General Wayne

Issued in memory of Gen. Anthony Wayne and to commemorate the 135th anniversary of the Battle of Fallen Timbers. First placed on sale September 14, 1929.

Sullivan Expedition

1929



Major General Sullivan

To commemorate the 150th anniversary of the Sullivan expedition in New York State during the Revolutionary War. This campaign defeated the Iroquois Indians and improved conditions for the white settlers.

Washington Bicentennial
1732



To commemorate the 100th anniversary of the birth of George Washington and issued in connection with the national celebration of this event. The designs are all portraits of Washington taken from famous paintings or drawings and show him at various periods of his life. First placed on sale January 1, 1932 at the post office in Washington, D. C.
