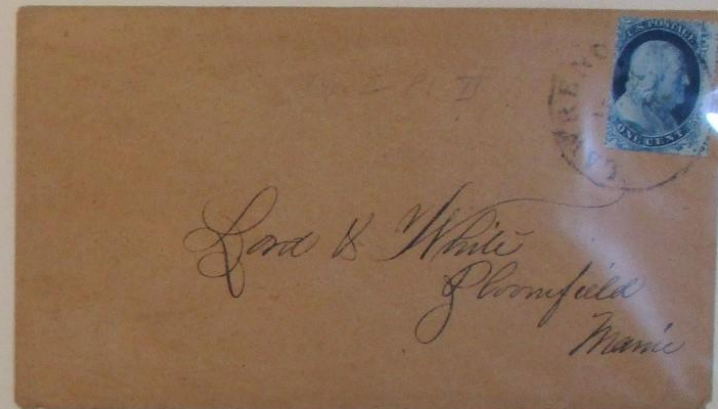

For the week ending Saturday, January 24, 1858.

There has been very little business of any description doing the past week, which is usually the case at this season of the year.

SUPERFINE FLOUR—The demand is quite limited, and shipping brands are offered at \$4.75 @ \$5, according to quality. Extras range from \$5.25 to \$7.

RYE FLOUR—Sells slowly at \$4 7/8 bbl.

CORN MEAL—Pennsylvania fresh ground is scarce and commands \$3.

WHEAT—Sales of Red at \$1.10 @ \$1.15, and White at \$1.18 @ \$1.25.

CORN—The receipts of New Yellow have fallen off, but the demand is moderate. We quote at 50 @ 55 cents, according to dryness.

MACKEREL—The transactions are confined to small lots from store. We quote nominally at \$9, \$8 and \$7, for 1's, 2's and 3's. There will be very little demand for Fish before the latter part of February.

PICKLED HERRING—Exceedingly dull. No Invoice sales through the week. Quote nominally at \$3 @ \$3.25.

SMOKED HERRING—The market is bare of scaled which we quote at 35 cents, No. 1's unsaleable.

PICKLED SCALEFISH—Quote at \$3.

PLASTER—Last sales at \$3.

LATHS—We quote fair quality nominal at \$1.25.

POTATOES—Nova Scotia are selling freely at 95 @ \$1.05.

COD OIL—A sale of 20 bbls at \$17—90 days.

FREIGHTS—Coal freights to Boston \$2.25 @ \$2.50, moderate sized vessels wanted for the West Indies and South America, Flour and Grain freights to Europe dull. The rates are 2s. 6d. for Flour and 8 1/2 @ 9d. for Grain.

EXCHANGE—The premium on New York and Boston has declined to one per cent.
